### **Safety improvement project at WIS 15 and Casaloma Drive intersection set to begin in Outagamie County**

*Work begins Tuesday, Sept. 6*

(Outagamie County) The Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) Northeast Region is announcing an intersection safety improvement project at WIS 15 and Casaloma Drive in the town of Grand Chute, Outagamie County, will begin Tuesday, September 6. The \$458,674 project involves the reconstruction of the northbound and westbound right turn lanes at the intersection, along with new traffic signals, and construction of a shared-use path. The project is expected to be complete by the end of October. Funding for the project is through the federal Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP). HSIP funding is allotted where safety concerns have been identified.

**Traffic impacts:**

- A closure of northbound Casaloma Drive, from Olde Casaloma Drive to the intersection, will occur in September.
- The maximum duration of this closure is 5 days.
- Access will be maintained to businesses.
- Various nighttime lane closures on WIS 15.
- Short-term restrictions on turning movements in the northbound and westbound right turn lanes.
- Some intersection turning movements may be restricted for durations up to one week.
- Access will be maintained to local businesses, residents throughout the project.

**Project safety benefits include:**

- A tighter curb radius that will allow for better sight distance by motorists.
- Promote better mobility for pedestrian and bicycle movements across WIS 15.
- Signal upgrades include pedestrian crossing and new LED lights.
