

Frequently Asked Questions

Where are the nearest dog parks?

The Outagamie County Dog Park is located at the intersection of French Road and Highway 00 (Northland Avenue). The park's summer hours are 7 a.m. to dusk, and the winter hours are 7 a.m. to 9 p.m. More information can be obtained by visiting their website at www.outagamiedogpark.com.

There is also a dog park operated by the City of Kaukauna. It is open from dawn until 11:00 p.m., year round. The Park is located on Farmland Drive on the North Side of Kaukauna. From Highway 41 take County Highway J exit. Turn south on Highway J (heading into Kaukauna). Cross Highway 00 and turn left on Farmland Drive. When Farmland Drive curves to right, turn left on the gravel road (between Hartung Fertilizer and Lamers Leasing). Follow driveway entrance to parking lot.

What do I do if I have lost my dog?

You may contact the Grand Chute Police Department at (920) 832-1575 to determine if your dog has been picked up by a member of the Police Department or a member of the community. You may also contact the Outagamie County Humane Society at (920) 733-1717. Humane Society hours are Monday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday 9 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.; Tuesday 9 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.; and Saturday 9 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Town of Grand Chute Dog Information

(Licensing, Rules, and Regulations)

Dog Licensing

Who needs to be licensed?

- The Town of Grand Chute requires licenses for dogs over 5 months of age.
- Newly obtained dogs over 5 months of age or dogs of new residents must be licensed within 30 days.
- There is no fee for the licensing of dogs used by the blind, deaf, or mobility impaired.
- We do not require licenses for other domesticated animals.



Applying for a dog license

You may apply for a Dog License either by mail or at the administration window located in Town Hall. The licensing year is January 1st – December 31st. Sale of the next year's license begins the first week of December of the current year. The license fee is **\$11.00** unless neutered or spayed, then the fee is **\$6.00**.

In Office:

Bring payment (cash or check), current rabies vaccination certificate, and proof of sterilization (spayed or neutered) to the administration window.

By Mail:

Complete the dog license application (found on the website or at the administration window) and send it with the rabies vaccination certificate, proof of sterilization, check or money order (made out to the Town of Grand Chute), along with a self-addressed stamped envelope, and we will return the license and documentation to you.

According to State Statute 95.21 we MUST see rabies vaccination information every year.

Town Ordinances Relating To Dogs (Reference Town Code 197)

(9) The owner or person having immediate control of an animal within the Town of Grand Chute shall promptly remove and dispose of in a sanitary manner any excrement left or deposited by said animal upon public or private property located within the Town of Grand Chute.

(10) Unlawful to own, harbor, or keep any animal that has been determined to be a public nuisance.

(12) No person or household shall keep more than six animals, the maximum number of dogs being three, the maximum number of rabbits being two, on any Town lot, land parcel, or dwelling unit, with the exception of puppies or kitties, which may be kept for a period of time not to exceed five months from birth.

See Forfeiture/Bond/Deposit Schedule for penalties for any owner of any animal who violates any provision of this section.
