The Grand Chute Fire Department investigated two fire incidents in January 2015

Jan 8 The Grand Chute Fire Department responded for a reported structure fire at 2839 W. Glenpark Drive. Upon arrival, Engine 2622 found there had been a small fire in the oven that was out prior to arrival. There was no damage to the structure or the appliance.

The estimated loss was \$0. The cause of the fire was classified as **Accidental** and was due to burnt food on the element.

Jan 20 The Grand Chute Fire Department responded for a reported vehicle fire at 720 N. Casaloma Drive. Upon arrival, Engine 2622 found flames and smoke visible in the engine compartment of a vehicle parked in the lot. Fire personnel used a pre-connected hose line to extinguish the fire.

The estimated loss was \$5000. The cause of the fire was classified as **Accidental** by the company officer and was possibly caused by an electrical short or mechanical problem.



The total available estimated dollar loss for January 2015 is estimated at \$5,000.

Training Division Monthly Report-January 2015

Scheduled Training Highlights:

- The department received an acquired structure (house) for training at 4121 North Lynndale Drive. The structure will be used for self-contained breathing apparatus confidence training that is required every year. We will also be conducting live fire training within the structure throughout the month of February. Neighboring departments were also invited to participate. Appleton, Town of Menasha and Greenville have committed to attending at least one session each.
- Six probationary firefighters began their semester long Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) course in January. This class is running two to three sessions per week in order to finish up and test at the end of May. This class is being taken through FVTC.

Safety & Health:

- One member continues to be out on medical and is currently performing light duty. No other injuries or accidents reported in the month of January.
- The department completed its annual PPE inspection program and PPE needing repair is being evaluated for repair or replacement.
- Next safety & health meeting is scheduled for February 17, 2015
