Turnout: Time elapsed between the dispatch and the fire unit departure from the station.

Travel: Time elapsed between the fire unit departure from the station and arrival on scene of the emergency.

GCFD Dedicates New Fire Station

Following more than twelve months of planning and construction, the Grand Chute Fire Department held a dedication ceremony



commemorating the opening of the new Fire Station #2 on Tuesday July 21st.

The facility was constructed following the

completion of a comprehensive study determining that fire and emergency services could be delivered more effectively and efficiently from the Spencer Street location.

The building replaced an existing forty year-old fire station

which previously served as the municipal court and police station, and had become plagued with increasing maintenance



costs. The new 10,500 square foot facility was completed within schedule and budget parameters, boasting energy efficient features including in-floor heating, high efficiency boilers, exterior LED lighting, and bi-fold bay doors.
