
The side-by-side sprinkler display not only provides a powerful reminder of the effectiveness of these systems, it also allows our crews to refine their basic fire fighting skills.

EMT Refresher Training Conducted

The month of September marked the start of our biannual Emergency Medical Technician refresher training cycle. To more effectively accommodate the needs of our members, Grand Chute Fire is partnering with the Fox Valley Technical College to host the training at our facility. This collaborative training opportunity, which was made available to our personnel as well as first responders from surrounding agencies, represents the first of five refresher classes to be offered between now and June of 2016. The 30-hour course



provides continuing education to our EMS providers on critical care topics and reinforces basic skills such as patient assessment, obstetrics, airway management, pediatric patient care, and medication administration.
