

# Town Of Grand Chute Dog License Application

Licensing Year: January 1 – December 31

License Expires December 31<sup>st</sup> of each year

License is due after January 1<sup>st</sup>

Sale of License starts December 1<sup>st</sup> for the next year's license

The license fee is \$11.00 unless neutered or spayed, then the fee is \$6.00.

If the dog becomes of licensable age or acquired after July 1<sup>st</sup>, the fee is half regular price.

Licenses and rabies vaccinations are required for all dogs 5 months of age or older.

Complete this application and send with:

- ▶ Rabies vaccination certificate. Not an invoice
- ▶ Proof of sterilization (neutered or spayed). This may be noted on the vaccination certificate
- ▶ Check or money order made out to Town of Grand Chute. **Do not send cash.**
- ▶ A self-addressed, **stamped** envelope to return the license and documentation to you.

Explanation of Late Fees: Owners are charged a State imposed \$5 late fee if they fail to purchase a license prior to April 1<sup>st</sup> for dogs that are 5 months or older by April 1<sup>st</sup> or 30 days after acquiring a licensable dog (5 months or older).

### Where are the nearest dog parks?

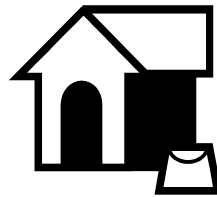
The Outagamie County Dog Park is located at the intersection of French Road and HWY 00 (Northland Ave). It is open from late spring to the first significant snowfall. More information can be obtained by visiting their website at [WWW.OutagamieDogPark.Com](http://WWW.OutagamieDogPark.Com).

There is also a Dog Park operated by the City of Kaukauna. It is open from dawn until 11:00 p.m., year round. The Park is located on Farmland Dr. on the North Side of Kaukauna. From Highway 41 Take Cty Hwy J exit. Turn south on Hwy J (heading into Kaukauna). Cross Hwy 00 and turn left on Farmland Drive. When Farmland Drive curves to right, turn left on gravel road (between Hartung Fertilizer and Lamers Leasing). Follow driveway entrance to parking lot.

## Frequently Asked Questions Cont.

### What do I do if I have lost my dog?

You may contact the Grand Chute Police Department at 920-832-1575 to determine if your dog has been picked up by a member of the Police Department or a member of the community. You may also contact the Outagamie County Humane Society at (920) 733-1717. Humane Society hours are Monday and Friday, Noon to 5:00 p.m.; Tuesday and Thursday, Noon to 7:00 p.m.; and Saturday, Noon to 3:00 p.m.

## Dog Licensing

### WHO NEEDS TO BE LICENSED?

- The Town of Grand Chute requires licenses for dogs over 5 months of age.
- Newly obtained dogs over 5 months of age or dogs of new residents must be licensed within 30 days.
- There is no fee for the licensing of dogs used by the blind, deaf or mobility impaired.
- We do not require licenses for other domesticated animals.



### APPLYING FOR A DOG LICENSE

You may apply for a Dog License either by mail or in the Clerk's Office located in Town Hall. The licensing year is January 1<sup>st</sup> – December 31<sup>st</sup>. Sale of the next year's license begins December 1<sup>st</sup> of the current year. The license fee is **\$11.00** unless neutered or spayed, then the fee is **\$6.00**.

#### In Office:

Bring payment (cash or check), current rabies vaccination certificate and proof of sterilization (spayed or neutered) to the administration window.

#### By Mail:

Complete the Dog license application (found on the website or at the Clerk's Office) and send with the Rabies vaccination certificate, proof of sterilization, check or money order made out to the Town of Grand Chute along with a self-addressed, stamped envelope and we will return the license and documentation to you.

**According to State Statute 95.21 we MUST see rabies vaccination information every year.**

### TOWN ORDINANCES RELATING TO DOGS (Reference Town Code 9.04)

(6)(a) The owner or person having immediate control of an animal within the Town of Grand Chute shall promptly remove and dispose of in a sanitary manner any excreta left or deposited by said animal upon public or private property located within the Town of Grand Chute.

(3) It shall be unlawful for any person within the Town of Grand Chute to own, harbor or keep any dog which:

- (a) Habitually pursues any vehicle upon any public street, alley or highway in the Town.
- (b) Assaults or attacks any person.
- (c) Is at large within the limits of the Town.
- (d) Habitually barks or howls to the annoyance of any person or persons.
- (e) Kills, wounds, or worries any domestic animal.
- (f) Is known by such person to be infected with rabies or to have been bitten by an animal known to have been infected with rabies.

See Forfeiture/Bond/Deposit Schedule for penalties for any owner of any animal who violates any provision of this section.
